
Developing our Forest School

At BCPS we are passionate about offering a broad and balanced curriculum and we really value the role outdoor learning has to play in that. We are fortunate to have our wild, woodland area (The Hollow as it is known) and Mr Machin, who is a fully trained Forest School Practitioner.

We believe that forest school experiences develop many essential characteristics in our pupils. We certainly feel that our setting fosters childrens' problem solving skills and cooperation skills. In our experience, it also helps develop their confidence and self esteem.

With all this in mind, we have been looking to improve our provision and resources. Recently we have used PTA funds in order to develop an outdoor classroom, which will have finishing touches (including some creosote) during the Summer Term. This will allow groups of ten or so pupils to continue learning outside when the rain gets too heavy to be in the forest. We have also bought an outdoor toilet (just for number ones!). This means that our youngest forest schoolers don't have to walk all the way back inside if nature calls. The children are so excited about our new additions. They are nearly as excited as Mr Machin! Thanks to you all for enabling this by supporting our PTA events.

We did this because excellent attendance is vital in ensuring the success and progress in learning for all of our pupils. Where attendance was excellent, it was noted and acknowledged. Where attendance needed to improve, we discussed it with parents and carers. We will continue to seek to improve as a whole school and, with this in mind, I will be reviewing and updating our School's Attendance Policy during the Summer Term. 95% is the National Average for attendance and BCPS aims much higher than this in order to support good progress for all of its young learners.
