The Nurture Room at BCPS

Over the past year, as a school, we have become more aware of the importance of considering our emotional health and wellbeing and the part that plays in education. As part of a whole school approach our staff have been encouraged to consider their own wellbeing and pupils are practising mindfulness in their classrooms. With this in mind, we are delighted to let you know that we have recently established The Nurture Room at Bollington Cross.

We run two Nurture Groups (KS1 and KS2) of 4-6 children who meet twice a week for a 10 week period. The aim of the group is to help the children build friendships with their peers and establish relationships of trust, talk about and understand their feelings, increase their self-esteem and confidence, and have a sense of belonging to the school community. This in turn will have a positive impact on children's learning.

Our first cohort started their nurture journey on the 1st October and are loving getting to know each other and working together as a team to improve their wellbeing.

We are looking forward to becoming a truly emotionally healthy school! (Mrs Allen)

Our outdoor classroom is now in use and the children are really enjoying this improvement to our Forest School at BCPS. Building and kitting out an outdoor classroom takes great effort and Mr Machin and Craig have worked tirelessly to ensure it looks inviting and provides good shelter from the elements. We have kept the cost of this project down by accepting donations of materials from local businesses. One such business is Stein IAS, who are a local business based in Clarence Mill. They were kind enough to donate the pin boards to board-out the inner-walls and provide a means to display children's work. They are always willing to help local causes and we thank them for their kind donation. We also used old furniture and work tops from classrooms in order



to create the seating area and tables. Solar-powered lights provide the finishing touch. We are really pleased with the project as it is having a great impact on ensuring the children access outdoor learning in even the most inclement British weather. More importantly, the children love it!
