Over the past week, we have been learning all about Diabetes and what impact it has on people. Ben (Year 6) has Type 1 Diabetes and it was his idea to have events in school which would raise awareness and money for Diabetes UK.

The week has been a great success and has included games, competitions, exercise, research and lessons: all with the aim of raising money and sharing knowledge across the school. Year 6 have designed lessons for each class, which has in turn, increased their own knowledge of Diabetes. Each class has run a mile, with a short introduction from Ben, on how exercise impacts on blood-sugar levels.

Thank you to Ben and Mrs Hancock for supporting school with the activities and resources. It has been great fun and we have raised £278. 32. Mr and Mrs Hancock have kindly agreed to match that, meaning that Diabetes UK will be getting a donation of £556.64! Well done to everyone involved.

With their frequent cake sales and two fantastic Discos, our amazing PTA have, yet again, been generating significant funds to buy resources and support school. We are aiming to become more and more transparent with just how we make use of these funds in the future. One significant purchase we have made recently, solely using PTA funds, was a complete restock of the KS1 Reading Scheme Books. This was something that we thought would have a great impact on engaging the children with fresh, modern, ageappropriate and interesting fiction and non-fiction texts. These books will last the school a long time. They cost £900 and will benefit a great many children in getting to grips with their reading skills and becoming life-long lovers of reading.

Our recent Spring Discos raised an incredible £550! Thank you all for supporting these events in giving your time and generous donations.
