Remembering Mrs Royle: Our new Memorial Trees

Last week, Mrs Royle's husband came in to plant two Memorial Trees with Reception. Mr Royle works in landscaping and gardening and was able to support school in choosing the right types of trees. He was keen to involve Reception, as were we, in planting the trees and reflecting on why they were being planted.

In the Reception playground planter, they planted an Amelanchier tree (also known as Snowy Mespilus or Juneberry). It was one of Mrs Royle's favourite trees. It has interesting leaf colours in spring and autumn, lovely white flowers in spring and red or purple berries in early summer.

In the orchard, they planted a Liquidamber tree (also known as Sweet Gum tree). They are very similar to Maples with an interesting leaf shape and beautiful autumn colour.

I will make all pupils aware of the significance of these trees and hope that they will be used as a place for children to reflect on the impact Mrs Royle had on them personally.

Emotionally Healthy School Ambassadors

On Tuesday 12th March, 2 pupils from Year 4 (Tyla and Teddy) and 2 pupils from Year 5 (Alessia and Zak) accompanied me to Tytherington School for the Tytherington Partnership Emotional Health Ambassador Training. This involved children from 7 other primary schools in addition to Bollington Cross. The programme runs over 3 days with the next sessions taking place in May and June. The aim of the programme is for the children to become emotional health ambassadors for their school and to:

- Understand the role of a mental health ambassador
- Be able to recognise what good and bad emotional health looks like

Understand how to signpost other children to get help and support As part of the programme the children will:

- Create an assembly and follow up classroom activities
- Develop an awareness day to host in their respective schools
- Organise a day of mental health awareness
