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In terms of the funds raised at PTA events, we communicated last year that these would be put towards a complete upgrade and refurbishment of the main school library in the newer building. In many school settings, libraries are prioritised in order to encourage a love of reading and inspire pupils to read more. As I keep saying on school tours of prospective parents – our refurbishment is more to give our pupils, who are already avid and keen readers, a library space which they deserve and continues to inspire them to widen their reading interests. It will mean that we start to use the building / space differently as the pupils will use the main entrance less and enter the hall through a different door for meals and assemblies. This is in an effort to maintain the quiet in the library space and also reduce anyone using it as a thoroughfare. Miss Bold is taking a lead on this, with new carpet and paint imminent and furniture delivered in January. See pics. How exciting for everybody! This initial investment will be on the carpet, painting and furniture. So please watch this space in terms of how you will be able to support raising money to invest in books through PTA donations and efforts this academic year.

Our curriculum at Bollington Cross continues to be broad and vibrant and we continue to invest in exciting resources to engage and inspire our pupils and also support wellbeing for teachers to try ensure a manageable workload. In this sense we are maximising our potential to improve by reducing how 'frazzled' the teachers could feel, so that they are able to give their best every day. This is an area which we will continue to invest heavily in in order to ensure subject leaders have time to assess their impact through their work to monitor, evaluate and champion their curriculum areas of responsibility.

Improving our sustainability is a very high priority at our school and with this in mind I expressed our interest in a bid to secure funding for a set of Solar panels on the roof of the ks2 building and an air source heat pump too. It will be amazing if this bid is successful and I will keep you posted on the outcomes of this.

Our school continues also to improve its financial independence by creating revenue by hiring out our pitch and hall. This has really taken off post-covid and it is great to see the building lit up at night being used by various community groups and local businesses. At a time when school budgets are tight, this is a much needed boost to our school budget each year and helps build our relationship with businesses and organisations in the community

When I arrived at Bollington Cross, just over 5 years ago, I thought there was so much potential in every area for the school to continue to develop. We have improved many areas of school already and we continue to do so and Bollington Cross still has a lot to look forward to!

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# Year 2: Muck, Mess and Mixtures!


