At our school, I feel assured that he vast majority of pupils move with ease from one adult to another, which is testament to the strong, positive relationships we nurture and encourage. Please do so again, as we will be starting parent tours after half-term.

In terms of school development, this year we have prioritised the areas of Mathematics, Special Educational Needs and Attendance. We look forward, once these plans are agreed by Governors, to working with parents to improve and develop in these areas throughout the year.

Learning in Year 2

This term in Science, Year 2 have been learning all about different habitats. We sorted animals and plants that live in coastal, rainforest, woodland and ocean habitats and thought about why each one was well suited to where it lives. We really enjoyed exploring our own forest habitat here at school and recording what wildlife lived there and why. Then we created food chains showing how energy is passed from one living thing to another in each of the different places.













Going Green

To update you all on our Air Source Heat Pump project – essentially everything is in place regarding the electrics and the plumbing and we now await the connecting up and commissioning of the ASHP. My understanding is that the ASHP may have less output than our gas boiler and therefore we have had extra heaters added around school to ensure that the output meets the requirements for the ks2 building. The solar panels, on the other hand, have been installed and working since about May and seem very efficient. They are generating 30kw hours at their optimum. The idea behind the project, is that the reduction in electricity usage gained by fitting the Solar Panels will then be utilised by the running of the ASHP. Whether this leaves us neutral across the year in terms of energy usage, remains to be seen, but the school is now much more sustainable with regard to its reliance on fossil fuels. I must thank our Chair of Governors, Fraser Penny, who has been instrumental in helping oversee the project with me (especially whilst I was out of the country in the Summer) and calculating all the usage and finance projections in the background! Our hope is that the planet, the school, and its pupils, benefit from these improvements for years to come.



TT Rockstars

We have some super Rock Star pupils that have been improving their their times tables knowledge on Times Tables Rockstars. This is a great way to practise times tables facts and speedy recall with various fun games at school and at home. They can challenge each other, collect coins and climb the leader board the more they play!
