As a staff this half-term, we have invested some time in reflecting together on our Learning Environment Policy. It has definitely increased creativity and also eradicated any boredom the astro-turf! A visiting school recently remarked how lucky the pupils are to have such engaging play equipment. We finished by being Scientists in the experiment gallery, learning about magnets, friction and light and taking on building challenges to see whether we could succeed as engineers in the future.

# Learning in Year 4

What a wonderful half-term it's been in Year 4! From dance workshops to designing wind-up cards, our class has been jam-packed with exciting learning opportunities. In English, we have enjoyed writing refugee narratives, based on the book, The Journey and in maths, we have progressed with multiplication and division as well as learning to calculate the perimeter of rectangles and polygons. In science, we loved learning about states of matter which included conducting interesting investigation to measure changes in state such as melting and evaporation. In art, we learned how to create different shades and textures with pencil and water colours. This influenced observational works as well as our Easter cards which were also inspired by the tradition crosses displayed on the way into Bollington. And how could we forget extra thrilling initiatives like World Book Day and a Chinese New Year dance workshop. # Learning in Year 5:

In Year 5 we have been exploring the isolating and yet hopeful story of The Promise. The children have created a third-person narrative that describes th lonely world a little girl lives in and the impact she had on her city. We then wrote a Newspaper Report to re-tell the positive impact like it was real life. Within Geography, we explored 'Why our oceans are important.' We investigated coral bleaching, over-fishing, tourism and plastic pollution. In Science, we have looking at and comparing the life cycles plants, birds, mammals and insects. In RE, we have been exploring the topic of 'How have expressions of worship changed over time?' through the religion of Christianity. For our DT day, we investigated pop-up books and designed our very own based on a nursery rhyme or short story.

## Learning in Year 3

Year 3 have had a really busy half term. They have connected with St-Johns in the Easter Experience and led worship for KS2 in the church.

We also managed to go to Dean Valley to connect with our pen-friends. We carried out a challenge where we had to search for clues across their grounds and then we enjoyed the weather and play equipment in another school.
